# The Origins of Old Home Day

The tradition of Old Home Day began in 1899, at the initiative of then Governor Frank Rollins, to help restore closeness, unity, and prosperity back to the state of New Hampshire.

At the end of the 19th century, New Hampshire had lost thousands of its inhabitants to the Civil War, the new frontier in the west, and the fast-paced lifestyle of the big cities. Once abandoned, the previously bustling and inviting communities and farms turned into ghost towns. The cozy homes they left behind fell into disrepair, green fields and pastures soon filled with weeds and brush, and the deep forests thick with trees were being cut down to help keep big business going. Times were difficult and depressing for the remaining residents, who remembered how beautiful and industrious their state once was.

New Hampshire Governor Frank Rollins knew the

success of his state was in jeopardy and that life in New Hampshire could not continue this way. He took it upon himself to make a change and devised a plan to reinvigorate the state and its failing economy. He decided to host a massive reunion in all cities and towns throughout the state.

It was to be a grand festival, celebrating all the wonderful things about New Hampshire and its citizens, both past and present. The governor wanted this celebration to encourage former residents to keep ties with their old communities, and he also hoped that those who left New Hampshire and found success elsewhere would want to stay connected to their roots by purchasing summer homes and other properties.

Governor Rollins wasted no time in drafting local towns to find current addresses of former Granite Staters across the country to send

them invitations to attend the very first Old Home Day celebration. The response was overwhelming. There was so much interest that an Old Home Week committee was formed at the State House.

Old Home Week's inaugural night was Saturday, Aug. 26, 1899. There were outdoor gatherings, complete with bonfires, from the mountains to the beaches. On Sunday, attendees sang hymns and former residents gave special services. Concord featured the biggest celebration that year, but other communities expanded their own celebrations after the first year, to include patriotic parades, outdoor concerts, baseball games, and contests, along with speeches and folklore expressing love for New Hampshire and the country.

Old Home Week did so well at revitalizing the state and its residents that the rest of New England quickly followed suit. Just two years

after the first Old Home Day was celebrated, Vermont and Maine decided to take up the tradition for themselves. By 1906, Massachusetts and Connecticut were celebrating Old Home Day and soon after, the idea spread throughout Pennsylvania, Ohio, Indiana, and even into four provinces in Canada.

Now, over 100 years later, New Hampshire is still observing Old Home Day. While many cities and towns have continued the tradition, hard times or lack of participation have prevented it from taking place annually in many communities across the state.

Only 10 communities have made sure Old Home Day is celebrated every year, and Londonderry is one of them. Citizens of Londonderry should take pride in knowing that, more than a century later, their hard work and dedication to this historic New

# Pastor Ken Glasier Named Parade Grand Marshal

The Old Home Day Committee has named Pastor Ken Glasier of Orchard Christian Fellowship as Grand Marshal of the Londonderry Old Home Day Parade.

"I was completely surprised. I'm grateful for the recognition," Glasier said

of the honor.

The position was created to honor a standout public servant in Londonderry, someone who has made a substantial contribution to the community through volunteerism.

Glasier, who has been pastor of the local church for eight years, has frequently and quietly offered his services to the commu-

nity.

"What we have experienced recently is as we don't offer as many welfare services through the Town, these things behind the scenes are 'miraculously happening,'" said Town Council Chairman John Farrell, noting in addition to helping families who are in need access services, Glasier is the Town's "go-

to behind-the-scenes volunteer."

Police Sgt. Glenn Aprile said Glasier has served on the Department's response team as a counselor to families in time of crisis.

"We go to some horrific scenes," Aprile said. "Pastor Ken spends time with the family. He has been a tremendous asset to us."

Roger Fillio said Glasier has "been invaluable" to the Londonderry Historical Society, and Old Home Day Chairman Kathy Wagner said Glasier has served on the Old Home Day Committee and is "a fixture of Old Home Day."

In addition to Glasier's assistance with Old Home Day, Orchard Christian Fellowship has been a Platinum Sponsor of Old Home Day for years, according to Farrell.

As Grand Marshal, Glasier will lead the Old

# Firemen Aiming to Extinguish Police Softball Streak

It's always fun and positive to have a good-natured rivalry rolling between town departments, and that has long been the case with the fire and police departments of Londonderry and their annual fundraising softball game during Londonderry Old Home Day.

But members of the town's fire department are keenly aware that, despite yeoman efforts each and every August, they haven't done a whole bunch of winning in the annual softball battles with the cops in recent years.

The police department won its ninth game in the last 10 years and its fourth in a row last August by tallying a 16-7 thumping of the firemen at the regular site of their annual games, the Matthew Thornton

The 2016 game is slated to be played on Friday, Aug. 19 at 6 p.m. back on that very same diamond, with members of the Londonderry Lions Club cooking up burgers and hot dogs for purchase so local folks can bring the family, grab some dinner, and settle in on lounge chairs or bleachers to enjoy the action.

Proceeds from the annual contest will benefit the Lions Club's beautiful Camp Pride in New Durham, which provides camp experiences for children and adults with mild to profound special needs.

During last August's fourth consecutive victory, the cops busted open a tight game by utilizing two home runs from detective

Chris Olson to win by the lopsided 16-7 tally.

The fire department squad last tasted victory back in 2011, but it did so with an exclamation point by walloping the police crew by a pretty stunning 23-6 tally. That win ended a five-year winning streak held by the cops.

However, the police department crew jumped

right back into the proverbial driver's seat with a rather tight 11-7 win in 2012, followed by an offensive thriller of a 27-20 police win in 2013 and an 18-7 thumping of the fire department contingent during August of 2014.

Every contest contains good-natured trash-talking, all kinds of offense, the occasional highlight-reel

defensive play, and laughter among the participants and their supporters alike. And with an exceptional cause like Camp Pride being the beneficiary of the funds raised on the evenings of the games, everybody actually walks - or in some cases limps - away from the Matthew Thornton diamond a real winner.

High School and Alvirne High School marching bands will make appearances. This year's parade Grand Marshal is Pastor Ken Glasier of Orchard Christian Fellowship.


Christine Patton, the parade chair on the Old Home Day committee, said there will be returning guests in this year's parade.

# Tradition Continues at 37th Annual Old Home Day Race

For more than 30 years, former Londonderry High School cross-country and track and field coach Larry Martin worked diligently to make the Londonderry Old Home Day/Lundgren 5K Road Race a special part of the town's annual festivities. And he certainly succeeded.

Martin has now stepped aside from the sizable job of directing the Londonderry Old Home Day races, handing the reins to his former Londonderry High athlete and present LHS boys' track and cross-country coach Matt Smith. And Smith has inherited an event which has earned both its impressive status and the excitement that swirls around it.

The 37th annual Londonderry Old Home Day/Lundgren 5K Road Race

will be held on Saturday, Aug. 20, at 8 a.m. regardless of whether it's bright and sunny or damp and soggy.

The annual event is one of the oldest races in New Hampshire, and its course takes participants through some of the most historic streets and beautiful country found in the town.

The course begins and ends on Mammoth Road in front of the town's Grange Hall. After receiving the starting signal, the 5K event proceeds south to Peabody Row, onto Buttrick Road, and loops back to the Grange Hall and the finish line. The annual event is USA Track and Field certified.

The 2015 Old Home Day race drew 209 participants, with Westford, Mass. resident Chris Mahoney winning it in 16 minutes and 40 seconds, and Pinkerton Academy teacher and coach Amy Bernard prov-

ing to be the female winner for the fourth consecutive year with her time of 19:13, 11th overall out of the large pack of runners.

Folks interested in running in this year's race - whose proceeds go as usual to the Londonderry Track Club Scholarship Fund - can register in several different ways. They can access the registration form at oldhomedays.com and drop the completed forms off at Embroidery Creations in

the Londonderry Professional Park or mail it to the Londonderry Track Club at P.O. Box 1036, Londonderry, 03053.

The pre-registration fee for non-Londonderry residents is \$20 and \$15 for town residents. Runners can also register the night before the race, Friday, Aug. 19, in the Londonderry High gymnasium from 5 to 7 p.m. at the above rates. Race-day registration will be held from 6:45 a.m. to just before race

time at the LHS gym at a cost of \$20 for everyone.

Specially-designed shirts will be presented to the first 250 race registrants. Many merchandise prizes will be raffled off at the conclusion of the race and all runners are eligible to win.

As is the case each year, plaques will be awarded to all male and female winners and runners-up in each of the following age groups: 12-and-under, 13-16, 17-19,

20-29, 30-39, 40-49, 50-59, 60-69, and 70-and-over.

The existing course records for the race have stood up for many years, with then-Londonderry resident Dave Dunham having established the top overall finishing time of 14 minutes and 44 seconds back in 1991, and Maribel Sanchez having set the top female time of 17:35 back in the first race of the new century in 2000.

# Town Common Hosts Over 70 Booths on Old Home Day


Regardless of the weather forecast, the Town Common will be home to about 70 12-foot by 12-foot booths from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Saturday, Aug. 20, in celebration of Old Home Day. Organizers note that booth rentals sell out every year. Old Home Day is a chance for the community to come together and celebrate where they came from. Local businesses and non-profits use this time as an opportunity to share with residents their causes and products and services. Non-profit organizations rent booths as a chance to raise money by selling food and drinks and sponsoring games.

For profit booths will typically have something to offer, such as candy, balloons, or small tokens for children of families who visit them.

There will also be two political booths, one for the Republican Party and one for the Democrats. Promotional political signs are permitted only in the area of the given party's booth.

The layout of the booths on the Town Common will follow the pattern of the last couple years.

As Mammoth Road will be temporarily closed on Saturday morning during the road race, Clark encourages organizations to set up their booths in advance. It is recommended that booths be set up the Friday before the big event to prevent congestion in the morning so that everything goes off without a hitch.

Organizations are also encouraged to set up a canopy for protection against extreme weather conditions.

## Old Home Day Parking

Motor vehicle parking is always at a premium around the Town Common on Old Home Day. Londonderry police, in cooperation with the Old Home Day Committee, are designating specific parking areas with easily visible signage.

The LPD asks motorists who choose to park along Mammoth and Pillsbury Roads to ensure their vehicles are adequately off the roadway. Drivers and their passengers are cautioned to practice safety when exiting and entering their roadside-parked vehicles. Motorists are encouraged to use defensive driving practices. Pedestrian traffic is heavy during key programs, such as the Lundgren Chiropractic 5K race and the parade. Visitors to Old Home Day are encouraged to carpool to the event and park in designated parking areas:

- Moose Hill School off Pillsbury Road, from the Common to the Morrison House Museum.
- Matthew Thornton School on Mammoth Road.
- Nelson Field Park off Mammoth Road, on Sargent Road next to the Central Fire Station.
- Londonderry Middle School off Mammoth Road.

# Captain Welsh's Company Brings Revolutionary Era to Life

Captain Welsh's Company will offer Londonderry residents a glimpse of the past at the Londonderry Historical Society's Morrison House grounds during Old Home Day.

On Friday, Aug. 19, about 10 members of the company will come to town in colonial dress and set up revolutionary era style tents as well as cooking facilities over an open fire. On Saturday, Aug. 20, the group will hold demonstrations and reenact 18th century life.

The goal of the group is to live as, and to demonstrate to people what the United States was like before the Civil War. Captain Welsh, leader of Welsh's Company, aims to keep our country's heritage alive through these fun and educational activities.

Welsh's company is

based on an American revolutionary militia unit from Southern New Hampshire.

Saturday morning, Revolutionary era demonstrations will take place at the Morrison House museum grounds on Pillsbury Road until about 4 p.m.

"We'll be making musket bullets, firing muskets,

cannons, and holding fire-making and cooking demonstrations," Welsh said.

There is no set schedule for specific demonstrations, but cannons are typically fired every hour on the hour and muskets are fired at every half hour.

be building tours, demonstrations of blacksmithing, spinning and weaving, cornhusk doll making, children's Colonial games, music, a May Pole, farmers' market and artisan craft fair. The Historical Society will offer a barbecue with chicken, ribs and pork.
