Planning Board Moves Plan on Brewster Road Home Forward

The town of Londonderry's Planning Board continued debating the situation of a building permit on Brewster Road at their meeting on Wednesday, June 3. The board was charged with making a recommendation to the Londonderry Town Council to allow to building inspector to issue the permit.

Members of the Planning Board conducted a site walk to the location prior to the meeting after a suggestion was made for it at the last meeting.

In addition to members of the Board, Scott and Darlene Ratte, the landowners and appli-

cants for the permit, also participated in the meeting.

Brewster Road is classified as a Class VI road, meaning it has not been upkept to travel standards or repaired by the town for five years or more. The board debated issues surrounding the safety of Brewster Road with the input of Brian Johnson of the Londonderry Fire Department.

As of September 2019, the State of New Hampshire has adopted the National Fire Protection Agency (NFPA) Fire and Life Safety Code. Regarding Brewster Road, there are issues with Fire Department access roads that are required for any struc-

tures built. Johnson clarified for the Board that NFPA codes are required by State law, where standards given by the NFPA are suggestions.

Johnson explained to the Board that according to NFPA regulations, Brewster Road does not meet the regulations to be considered a Fire Department access road. NFPA code includes specific dimensions for these roads, such as a minimum of twenty feet in width and thirteen feet vertically.

Johnson added that "the big thing that we're not seeing is it also requires a turn around on roads longer than 150 or a cul-de-sac at

Taking up a majority of the meeting was discussion of how to best celebrate the senior class of 2020. There have been many things done to celebrate the seniors so far virtually or complying with social distancing guidelines. For example

Town Seeks Bids for New Council Chambers Project

The Town of Londonderry is currently accepting design/build bids for the construction of a single story, approximately 50x56' structure, consisting of one conference room (Town Council Chambers), two ADA compliant restrooms, mechanical room, video recording room, and one storage room in the new addition.

The location of the new addition will be where the former SAU building existed, next to

the existing Town Hall location at 268B Mammoth Road.

A summary of the new addition was listed as: Concrete slab, no basement; 2x6" Wood Framing; Engineered Truss System; Asphalt shingles (matching existing Town Hall); Brick for exterior walls (matching existing Town Hall); Thermal Pane Windows (matching existing town hall, in color and size); Forced Hot Air Heat (natural gas)/AC; Fire Suppression System (wet &

dry); Fire Alarm System; Electrical; and Plumbing.

Renovation of the existing Moose Hill Conference Room (Town Council Chambers) into two offices, two storage areas, and convert an existing Video Recording room into a storage area. Summary of the renovation area: Remove existing raised chambers platform, reuse in new addition. Remove existing three presentation desks, recuse in new addition. Add floor to ceiling walls to con-

struct the new offices and storage areas. Modifications and/or additions to existing electrical, fire alarm, possibly sprinkler head(s) to support the new layout. No know plumbing modifications.

The town listed the project's Time of Completion, as Jan. 4, 2021 to have a weather tight structure, followed by a Feb. 19, 2021 completion of the project (Interior & Exterior, including any punch list items).

BID packages are

available in the Town Manager's Department or www.londonderry-nh.org after May 27, 2020.

There will be a mandatory pre-bid conference at the site on June 9, 2020 at 8 a.m. at 268B Mammoth Road.

Sealed BIDs must be received at the Londonderry Finance Department by Tuesday, July 14, 2020 no later than 2 p.m. BIDs submitted after this time will not be accepted. If forwarded by mail, the sealed enve-

lope containing the proposal and marked as directed below, must be enclosed in another envelope addressed to the Town of Londonderry, Attn: Finance Department Purchasing Agent, 268B Mammoth Road, Londonderry, NH 03053, preferably by registered mail.

Sealed BIDs must be received no later than 2 p.m. on Tuesday, July 14, 2020. They will be publicly opened and read on Tuesday, July 14, 2020 at 2:15 p.m..

the end."

The options for Brewster Road are to either improve the road

up to NFPA Fire Safety Code regulations or adopt a plan that offers an equivalent level of safety, referred to as a variance.

According to recent measurements, Brew-

ster Road is fifteen feet wide, making it five feet short of the NFPA requirement. In order to widen Brewster Road, two telephone poles would be moved and upgraded. There would need to be a turnaround, like a cul-de-sac, added to end of the Brewster Road to accommodate the turning radius of a fire truck.

Board Vice Chairman, Chris Davies, sug-

gested that the Board recommends to the Town Council that the town of Londonderry be responsible for the improvements necessary to bring Brewster Road up to NFPA code. Davies based his opinion on the road's public access to Scobie Pond, and the fact that since that area is considered a conservation area, and the town promotes its use, the town has a responsibility to main-

tain its safety.

Assistant Director of Public Works and Engineering John Trottier stated that the town is not allowed to spend money on a class VI Road unless it's for maintenance.

Other members of the Board, including Jake Butler advocated that the responsibility for the improvements to Brewster Road should be on the landowners seeking the permit, Scott and Darlene Ratte.

Board member Al Sypek advocated that the Planning Board

should defer to the Town Council to make the decision on who is responsible for the improvements to Brewster Road.

The Planning Board agreed to recommend that the Town Council grant the applicants, Scott and Darlene Ratte, the building permit, with the condition that the road is brought up to the NFPA code.

The board was clear that the improvements should include both a turn around and widening the road.

No decision was made at that meeting, and would be made after the board held a site walk on Brewster Road.

I believe Butler was reacting to comments made about the article he saw posted on Facebook and the comments made about it, not the article itself.

Butler also made some editorial comments about the newspaper and its publisher, who was attending the meeting via Zoom.

Certainly in poor taste, and the chair should have stopped him long before he was allowed to make that huge deviation from the discussion at hand.

Regarding General Flynn

To the editor,

Regarding the alleged victimization of General Flynn, will respond in two parts.

First, the legitimacy of the Mueller Investigation. Robert Mueller (Captain, USMC) was appointed to investigate Russian Interference in the 2016 election. His report concluded that "The Russian government interfered in the 2016 presidential election in sweeping and systematic fashion." His investigation established that "a Russian entity carried out a social media campaign that favored presidential candidate Donald J. Trump and disparaged presidential candidate Hillary Clinton" and that, "a Russian intelligence service conducted computer-intrusion operations

against entities, employees, and volunteers working on the Clinton Campaign and then released stolen documents."

"The investigation also identified numerous links between the Russian government and the Trump Campaign." Although the investigation established that both the Russian Government and the Trump Campaign benefited these activities, the investigation did not establish that members of the Trump Campaign conspired or coordinated with the Russian government in its election interference activities."

Second with respect to the treatment of General Flynn. On Nov. 30, 2017 General Flynn signed a plea agreement with the Special Counsel that detailed false statements he made about discussions with Russian Government, and about his work for the Government of Turkey. He further agreed to be a cooperating witness for the Special Counsel's office.

His acceptance of the plea agreement states "I have read every page of this Agreement and have discussed it with my attorneys, Robert K. Kellner and Stephen P. Anthony. I fully understand this Agreement and agree to it without reservation. I do this voluntarily and of my own free will, intending to be legally bound. No threats have been made to me nor am I under the influence of anything that could impede my

ability to understand this Agreement fully. I am pleading guilty because I am in fact guilty of the offense identified in this Agreement."

In a sentencing hearing on December 18th 2018, General Flynn raised his concerns with the manner and conduct of his FBI interview. The Judge stated "I cannot recall any incident in which the Court has ever accepted a plea of guilty from someone who maintained that he was not guilty, and I don't intend to start today." The judge continued with a lengthy series of questions about his to assure himself General Flynn was aware that lying to the FBI was a crime and that despite any concerns about the personnel conducting the interrogation that it was General Flynn's desire to continue to plead guilty. The Judge concluded "I am satisfied that Mr. Flynn entered his guilty plea while competent and capable. He understood at that time the nature of the charges against him and the consequences of pleading guilty. Having carefully read all the materials provided to the Court in this case, including those materials reviewed under seal and in-camera, I conclude that there was and remains to be a factual basis for Mr. Flynn's plea of guilty."

ing closely with Castle-ton (event venue) to generate ideas on a social distancing prom. Whether that involves a mixture of indoor and outdoor seating and designated dancing spots, it is still unclear with the present guidelines offered by the state when or if this might be possible this summer. However, if not a prom then the

administrative staff and class officers are hoping to plan some sort of event where the senior class can be together, but also follow guidelines.

There were several options given by Parent for a possible graduation ceremony to be held in the last week of July. It does not look like having graduation at the SNHU Arena is a viable option, as the arena will only be allow-

ing 200 people on the floor at a time. The school board and Parent agreed that planning towards an outdoor ceremony would be the best option. One of those options would be to hold it on the LHS football and baseball field, where it was held before moving to the SNHU arena. As with everything these days, due to the pandemic there would need to be careful planning as there are concerns re-

garding how many people could attend, can students walk across the stage to accept their diplomas, and how can it be arranged so everyone can see and hear. There is also the option of using a company called Events United. The com-

pany is planning to use the overflow lot at the Manchester airport to create a concert venue made for social distancing. It would include a stage, a big screen, and individual parking spots with space beside them to set up chairs to watch

the event. It is not traditional, but it offers seniors the chance to walk across the stage and have their family be present. The cost would be relatively the same, as the high school would be combining graduation and baccalaureate together. The school board was in agreement that an outdoor graduation is the best option and is in favor of either idea. There was no final decision made as the board is waiting for word from the governor about the next phase of reopening on June 15.

Arthur (Art) R. Hanlon, 94, of Londonderry, NH, formerly of Pelham, NH & Winthrop, MA, died May 29, 2020 at home with his wife Barbara by his side after several years of declining health and complications. Arthur was born Feb. 19, 1926, a Son of William Augustus and Mary (Mae) Sarah (Schwartz) Hanlon.
