

Other members of the Board, including Jake Butler advocated that the responsibility for the improvements to Brewster Road should be on the landowners seeking the permit, Scott and Darlene Ratte.

Board member Al Sypek advocated that the Planning Board

should defer to the Town Council to make the decision on who is responsible for the improvements to Brewster Road.

The Planning Board agreed to recommend that the Town Council grant the applicants, Scott and Darlene Ratte, the building permit, with the condition that the road is brought up to the NFPA code.

The board was clear that the improvements should include both a turn around and widening the road.



Regarding General Flynn

To the editor, Regarding the alleged victimization of General Flynn, will respond in two parts.

First, the legitimacy of the Mueller Investigation. Robert Mueller (Captain, USMC) was appointed to investigate Russian Interference in the 2016 election. His report concluded that "The Russian government interfered in the 2016 presidential election in sweeping and systematic fashion." His investigation established that "a Russian entity carried out a social media campaign that favored presidential candidate Donald J. Trump and disparaged presidential candidate Hillary Clinton " and that, "a Russian intelligence service conducted comput- influence of anything

ees, and volunteers working on the Clinton Campaign and then released stolen documents."

"The investigation also identified numerous links between the Russian government and the Trump Campaign." Although the investigation established that both the Russian Government and the Trump Campaign benefited these activities., the investigation did not establish that members of the Trump Campaign conspired or coordinated with the Russian government in its election interference activities."

Second with respect to the treatment of General Flynn. On Nov. 30, 2017 General Flynn signed a plea agreement with the Special Counsel that detailed false statements he made about discussions with Russian Government, and about his work for the Government of Turkey He further agreed to be a cooperating witness for the Special Counsel's office.

His acceptance of the plea agreement states "I have read every page of this Agreement and have discussed it with my attorneys, Robert K. Kelner and Stephen P. Anthony. I fully understand this Agreement and agree to it without reservation. I do this voluntarily and of my own free will, intending to be legally bound. No threats have been made to me nor am I under the er-intrusion operations that could impede my

against entities, employ- ability to understand this Agreement fully. I am pleading guilty because I am in fact identified in this Agreement."

In a sentencing hearing on December 18th General Flynn 2018, raised his concerns with the manner and conduct of his FBI interview. The Judge stated "I cannot recall any incident in which the Court has ever accepted a plea of guilty from someone who maintained that he was not guilty, and I don't intend to start today." The judge continued with a lengthy of questions series about his to assure himself General Flynn was aware that lying to the FBI was a crime and that despite any concerns about the personnel conducting the interrogation that it was General Flynn's desire to continue to plead guilty. The Judge concluded "I am satisfied that Mr. Flynn entered his guilty plea while competent and capable. He understood at that time the nature of the charges against him and the consequences of pleading guilty. Having carefully read all the materials provided to the Court in this case. including those materials reviewed under seal and in-camera, I conclude that there was and remains to be a factual basis for Mr. Flynn's plea of guilty. "




