## Local Police Continue to Investigate Car Break-Ins

On August 25 of this year, there were a series of break ins involving up to 30 cars in the Londonderry area. These thefts

occurred throughout town around the area of Colonial Drive, Columbia Drive, Lawson Farm Road, Alexander Road, Tanager Road, and Justin Circle.

Although these were

like another crime that occurred back in January, this was on a much larger scale. Although only one car was stolen and subsequently recovered in Connecticut,

## Water Task Force Chairman Gives Opinion on Findings

The subject of clean drinking water has been a major concern for the citizens of Londonderry. Over the past few years, an increasing number of contaminants have infiltrated the town's water supply. This has led to town officials taking steps to implement changes in the way water treatment and testing, as well as locating the sources of the contamination.

The primary contributor to PFAS concerns is the Saint-Gobain Performance Plastics plant in Merrimack. Wind carrying exhaust from the plant has led to an increasing number of PFAS (polyfluoroalkyl substances) in several Londonderry wells.

PFAS are manmade chemicals that have several adverse effects to the human body if exposed for prolonged periods of time. These include decreased chances of fertility, high cholesterol, and thyroid

disease.

Since this was discovered, a consent decree has been filed due to the company's failure to implement equipment to monitor air pollution control. The court order held SGPP accountable for their error and as such, the company is under strict supervision to undertake drastic action to change their policy and practices.

The Londonderry Town Council recently met and discussed pro-

## Ice Cream Shop Request Denied by Zoning Board

During the Wednesday, Sept. 15, Londonderry Zoning Board of Adjustment meeting one of the cases that they heard was in regards to a variance request to allow Melissa DiNoto, to operate an ice cream shop located at 104 Harvey Road. The zoning that is the Industrial II zone doesn't allow restaurants.

It was explained by DiNoto, that the location would be near the Rail Trail and it is intended to be complementary to the area since it can be a place for people to rest and to get refreshment. She said that currently there isn't anything like

it in the zone.

She explained that currently she operates a mobile ice cream shop called Sweet Plane View, which is located at the Aviation Museum. Her goal she said would be to open her business in a building instead of having the mobile shop.

Because of its location that is right near the Manchester-Boston Regional Airport she said that her building would look like an airport hangar.

Through her business she said that she has been able to promote both the museum and the rail trail and would continue to do so in her new location if she was approved.

One question asked was if they would have any seating there.

DiNoto said that she would want to.

"Ideally I would enjoy having indoor seating," she said.

Another question that was asked by the Board was whether or not it would be a seasonal business or if it would be open all year round.

She said that it would

# Londonderry ZBA Approves Variance For Storage Structure

During the regularly scheduled Londonderry Zoning Board of Adjustment meeting on Sept. 15, the Board heard a special exception request from Timothy Cerato the owner of 1 Burbank Road, in regards to having a portable storage structure on his property.

He explained that he was able to find an 8.5 x 20 storage container near Boston that was previously used for storage and then was converted into a shed.

He explained that he bought it last year in

early September with the intention of using it as a shed to store his lawn mower, winter tires, power tools and other things of that nature.

When he bought it he explained that he removed the traditional metal doors on it and replaced it with French doors.

He said that he wants to be able to keep the structure on his property permanently.

Cerato explained that it's not very noticeable from the driveway or from the road.

During the meeting

no abutters came forward to oppose the special exception from being approved or for it to be denied.

Some of the conditions that were proposed by the Board were to have it inspected by the Londonderry Building Inspector, and to verify the wetland setback for the property.

They also will need to verify that it is no more than 10 feet high, eight feet wide, and 20 feet long.

The Board ultimately approved the variance with a vote of 4-1.

Also during the meeting the Board heard a variance

request from The Gardocki Family Trust who is the owners of 10 Sheridan Drive.

It was explained by Tucker McCarthy who is acting as the developer's representative that they were seeking a variance to have 50.28 feet of frontage where 150 feet is required.

He explained that the property is on 7.93 acres of land and their intention is to subdivide it into four lots for single-family homes.

Tom Quinn, the attorney for the owners that aside from having a home on the lot they also had a landscaping

business there, which is no longer in business, explained it. As a way of continuing to use the property it was decided to subdivide it.

He explained that originally they got the variance for the frontage approved for when they only had the single-family home there. Since they want to have the house there still with the other homes as part of the subdivision they need to get the variance approved again for the frontage.

McCarthy said that all of the other lots they are creating would meet all of the zoning

regulations.

The Board unanimously approved the variance request.

In other news the Board was supposed to hear two variance requests from Renegades Pub North, which is located at 103 Nashua Road.

Since two of the Board members had to recuse themselves the applicant asked that they had their case continued. This is allowed if there aren't enough alternatives to have a full voting Board. The case is now expected to be heard during their Oct. 20 meeting.

cedures to correct this issue.

Town Councilor Tom Dolan, who chaired a water task force over the spring and early summer addressed the council and was very forthcoming about what he thinks should be done. "We're organized

around three separate goals" he began "To identify what the PFAS standards were and how to test for them, how to mitigate those contaminants and communication efforts within the community...we need to help spread the word and educate our fellow citizens."

Some of the areas for concern were the con-

sistent levels of arsenic which are still relatively high, and Trottier reinforced the dangers PFAS. "We looked at the toxicology of the PFAS chemical, it's an emerging science right now. Even the toxicologist of the state doesn't have all the answers. What we do know and is troubling is that PFAS is one of those chemicals that

accumulates in the human body and is not one of the chemicals that is cleansed out...we don't know what the long-term effects are."

Londonderry residents are currently responsible for the testing of their own water supply. "The residents of Londonderry are on their own, they have to test their own water" Dolan explained. In terms of mediation, residents of the town can filter their water supply at the faucet, or implement filtration for their entire home. "We've spoken about a town wide water system...but it would be very expensive."

Dolan also addressed public education and communication of these new procedures to the community. "We wanted to make sure we answered the public's questions accurately and in a timely manner." The task force that Trottier oversaw will be given financial help of an undisclosed amount to assist them in the purification effort. "We hopefully will have enough money as a town in order to help our residents."

This served as a point of contention for board member Deb Paul, and she voiced her opinion at the meeting. "If Saint-Gobain is

the major contributor to the major pollution problems we're seeing in our town, why is it that we, the taxpayers of the town have to be responsible? We didn't pollute the water," Paul said.

The discussion continued, and an idea was proposed that Londonderry should have their own water committee. Although this situation is a hot button issue, Dolan reminded the board that he thinks Londonderry is the most forward-thinking town in the state when it comes to monitoring and solving the issue of water contamination.

# Spirit Airlines Will Be Touching Down in Manchester

A new air carrier will soon be seen over Londonderry. Ted Kitchens, director of aviation at the Boston-Manchester Regional Airport, appeared at the Sept. 13 Town Council meeting and announced that Spirit Airlines would soon be offering flights to Florida on a regular basis. New Hampshire residents won't have to wait long. Spirit officially becomes part of the Manchester fleet on Oct. 7 of this year and non-stop flights to Orlando and Ft. Lauderdale will

begin the same day.

The airline will also offer nonstop flights to Ft. Meyers four times a week beginning Nov. 17 and three nonstop flights a week to Tampa beginning on the Nov. 18.

Spirit Airlines offer fares that severely undercut the competition by a large amount. A round trip flight begins at \$131, as opposed to Southwest Airlines whose prices are close to \$800.00. Spirit also have one of the youngest fleets in the sky in terms of newly built planes and have never had an accident that resulted in a fatality.

What they have to offer New Hampshire residents is something that airports all over the country have desperately wanted; lower fares, more destinations, and direct flights.

This is a new partnership, and Kitchens made it apparent that involvement from the community will be essential in order to expand the airlines' involvement. "If the community buys enough tickets, I am confident that they will expand their offerings out of Manchester." Kitchens also added that "If the community doesn't, it might be

decades before another airline enters the market." \$400,000.00 was given to Manchester Airport to market Spirit Airlines and this is one of the first times a sum this large has been granted.

Because of the pandemic, flights out of Manchester became almost completely nonexistent in 2020. Since February of this year, there has been a massive improvement in ticket purchases and flights out of the airport. A chart displayed by Kitchens illustrated this dramatic increase. From April of 2020 to February there have been approximately 50,000 cus-

tomers getting on a plane to travel. Spirit Airlines will be bringing in 600 seats a day and Kitchens hopes this will get to the projected goal of 80,000 by May or June of 2022 at the earliest, and 2023 at the absolute latest. Recovery has been swift, and it was noted that there will be a slight drop off throughout September, and a gradual rise as people prepare to travel for the holidays. Kitchens also noted that the airport has generated enough revenue to maintain its stability until the end of the current fiscal year.

The addition of Spirit Airlines wasn't the only

good news that Kitchens had to offer. With more cargo arriving into Manchester, it was also announced that construction of a new cargo hanger would begin. Kitchens hopes to draw more business in terms of commerce and transportation to Manchester and away from Logan. A larger hanger will be helpful in subsidizing the operating cost as more and more commercial aircraft begin to come in. Kitchens also plans on implementing a plan to have Manchester Airport become accessible by bus and train in the foreseeable future.

there were extensive reports of stolen property such as bank cards, laptops and cellular phones.

All 30 vehicles were left unlocked by their owners.

Captain Kim Bernard, chief of operations for the Londonderry Police Department addressed the town council last week to give an update on the current investigation and offer advice to citizens to prevent future acts of theft. "It only takes two seconds to lock your car doors," Bernard stated. "It takes

a long time to come over being victimized this way" he continued, referring to the trauma that some people feel after having their personal property stolen.

"Right now, the case is still ongoing...we have some strong leads and we were able to recover a lot of property," Bernard continued regarding the investigation. "The recovered vehicle has been processed for fingerprints and DNA...we have some suspects that we are trying to ID. They aren't local. They're out of Connecticut...we're working with the departments down there."

Most alarming was

the size and scale of the car theft operation. This was a well-organized and planned operation. Bernard explained the method in which the crimes committed.

"There was more than one person doing this. They were a group of young adults and they were going from neighborhood to neighborhood. They would be dropped off in one section, take off on foot, meet up on the next street, drop the belong-

ings, and then go to the next neighborhood." Bernard also stressed the importance of the police in the community and that now more than ever, they are here to help. "From the Police department standpoint, it's never a dumb idea to call and ask us. If it's important to you and the community, it's important to us. If you call us we'll listen to you and give you any guidance we can. As far as the break in go...once we

get this thing solved, we'll put something out on the social media platforms and advise the community."

The Londonderry Police Dept. recommends that citizens refrain from leaving any valuables in their car and always lock your car doors. If your car has been rifled through or damaged by an unknown party, file a police report right away. This investigation is still an ongoing process, but

# Editorial

## Read Twice, Send Once

Less than 50 years ago the only modes of communication were by phone, often with time restrictions, and by letter – now a notion romanticized by rom-coms and historical dramas. Before the invention of the Internet, or rather social media, no one had to worry about what they said over the phone or in a letter; a phone call could be forgotten, a letter burned or thrown away.

Today, it is far too easy to write something up be it email, text, or social media status, and send it off into the complicated world of technology. It takes two seconds to think of something and press send, and it takes even less time for the ramifications to come back and bite you.

We see it every day on the news: Celebrities being torn apart for an ill timed or badly worded joke, the press scrutinizing the President's character on Twitter. While this attention may not ruin a celebrity's life or career, it is a different story for small businesses like a pizza place or how a school can be detrimentally affected by a simple miscommunication.

All it takes is an angry citizen to get hold of something and post it on social media for a

maelstrom of negativity and widespread recognition to occur. Social media begets hate, and often does not allow those who made a mistake in a post or an email to correct themselves before the damage is done.

There is a quick solution to this, though not a bullet proof one: Editing.

Taking a pause before hitting send, especially for a business or other local establishment, is essential in making sure miscommunications don't happen – or are at least less likely to. Though there are positive sides to the speed and wide reach of social media – like if there really is something wrong with a business or establishment it can be identified and brought to the attention of the public quickly and effectively – it is not the greatest platform for mistakes.

When errors in emails or posts happen, they don't just go away. They get shared and remain on the Internet forever, unwittingly popping up at the least opportune times, potentially causing problems in the future.

The Internet can be a friend or an enemy, and a simple fact check or contextual edit can be the deciding factor for which one it is.

## Highly Botched Afghanistan Withdrawal And Evacuation

To the editor,  
The United States (U.S.) believed the Afghan military would stand up to the Taliban, but over the years the Taliban has overcome Afghan forces in skirmishes in Afghanistan; and the Taliban showed its prowess when it conquered Afghanistan in the 90s.

On July 13, 2021, a month before the Taliban overran Afghanistan, U.S. embassy personnel sent a cable to Secretary of State Blinken warning him the Afghanistan government was collapsing and an evacuation of Americans and Afghans should start immediately.

I agree with the decision to leave Afghanistan, but the execution of the withdrawal was terrible. What is astonishing is we did not have a contingency plan to protect the Kabul area by keeping troops in a perimeter around Kabul allowing for the evacuation of diplomats, American citizens and Afghans. If needed, another 10,000, or 20,000 or more troops and equipment should have been available for evacuation duty. Why did we take a chance the Taliban would not overrun the country? Why did we assume

there would be an orderly withdrawal over an extended period of time? Shouldn't we plan for a worst case scenario? When I was in the Intelligence Division on a combined Navy staff we always incorporated worst case contingency planning.

Why didn't we have civilian and military aircraft available to airlift tens of thousands of people out of Afghanistan? Why didn't we have a plan to retain a presence at the vast and highly defensible facilities of the Bagram Air Base in case it would be needed as part of the withdrawal?

We rushed an Afghanistan withdrawal without comprehensive contingency planning.

We have to support the National Resistance Forces in northern Afghanistan by supplying arms and material, which might keep the terrorists off balance and thwart attacks against us.

# Boston Post Cane Holder Takes Honor Flight New England

It started with a chance meeting at Wendy's back in 2019. While standing in line for a couple of Junior Bacon Cheeseburgers, the woman in front of us happened to look back and spied my friend Forrest Pratt's Air Force Veteran's cap. She thanked him for his service and casually asked him if he had been to Washington DC to see the veterans memorials honoring those who served their country. When he said, "No," she explained about the efforts of Honor Flight New England, a non-profit organization started by Joe Biron a dozen years and now 59 flights ago, dedicated to honoring the service and sacrifices of our nation's most senior veterans. They want to

make sure they connect with as many of our oldest veterans as possible to give them "the trip of a lifetime," as many returning veterans call it, to see those monuments and memorials that honor them before it is too late. She mentioned she knew Adam Sexton at WMUR, who had connections to the group and slipped him a piece of paper with a number to call.

His daughter Brenda called the number, got the details, and then filled out an application with her dad. Forrest's originally scheduled Honor Flight in May 2020 was cancelled due to concerns about COVID-19, as was the October 2020 flight. So they waited.

At 92, Forrest Pratt is just a regular guy who was born in Londonderry, grew up in town, was

a boy scout, a volunteer fire fighter for the Town of Londonderry, drove a truck during the week, worked the town road crew weekends, served his country from 1950-54 during the Korean War, came home and married a beautiful girl from Londonderry, and together they raised three wonderful kids in the home he still lives in. Yes, in Londonderry.

In 2018 he was awarded Londonderry's Boston Post Cane for his longevity and service to the town and in this year's 2021 Old Home Day Parade was thrilled to be squired down Mammoth Road, along with his daughter Brenda, in a snazzy convertible in recognition of that honor. He didn't realize that recognition, in another form, would be soon on its way.

Before dawn on Sun-

day, Sept. 12, 25 veterans who were set to fly out on Honor Flight New England #59, the first Honor Flight since November of 2019, assembled at the Manchester-Boston Regional Airport Crash Fire Rescue Facility on Kelly Ave. Forrest was among them. Each had a "guardian" as a companion on the trip- Forrest's grandson Bradley Horning, himself a veteran of the Army Reserves, would accompany Forrest. Along with a medical team and founder Joe Biron, the group left in two buses for Logan Airport, after a wonderful sendoff by the NH Police Association Pipes & Drums and escorted by Manchester Police, Londonderry Police, NH State Police, the Hillsborough County Sheriff, and the Patriot Guard Riders, all exiting under

The Londonderry Fire Department's tribute to the veterans- a huge American flag hung between two ladder trucks.

After another wonderful sendoff in Boston, they landed at Baltimore-Washington International Airport and again boarded buses for their ride to Washington, DC.

The WWII Memorial was their first stop. Forrest's niece and her husband and daughter unexpectedly surprised them there, with a series of big hugs all around. They found the New Hampshire pillar and took photos.

They next visited the moving tributes at the Vietnam Veterans Memorial Wall, then the Korean War Veterans Memorial and the Lincoln Memorial. Finally they headed to Arling-

be a seasonal business only.

Deb Paul, who is the Town Council Liaison for the Board said that she thinks they need to have more information before they make a decision

about it.

"I think this is a great idea, I'm just concerned about the size of the building and the traffic and the amount of growth and the fact that once you change it you change it forever, it stays with the property forever," she said.

While she said that she wasn't for or against it she said that the need to get more information.

Londonderry ZBA Chairman Neil Dunn said that he also agreed that they needed to get more information.

"I don't feel we have enough information," he

said.

The Board received five letters in favor of allowing the variance.

One of them was from the Aviation Museum of New Hampshire.

"Having a concession offering ice cream and food in the vicinity would be a positive

development for the aviation museum," the letter stated.

Another letter came from the Londonderry Trailways.

"Londonderry Trailways believes that your business with its proximity to the rail would greatly benefit the community of Londonderry and firmly enhance the spirit of the rail trail," said Bob Rymal, the president of the organization.

One of the abutters, Donald Mendzela, from Gerard Laflamme Inc., expressed their concerns in a letter. Some of the things they had questions about includ-

ed what the hours of operation would be, and what the size of the building would be.

They said without answers to their questions they would be opposed to it.

"We also have concerns regarding a precedent being set allowing an industrial II zone change to allow a restaurant. If 104 Harvey Road is allowed now then why not 98 Harvey Road and 1 Plainview Drive which are larger properties," the letter stated.

The board members ultimately denied the variance with a unanimous vote.

# Lancers Add Cardinals to the Beaten List with 29-13 Win

The Londonderry High School Football team chalked up another notch in the win column at home on Friday night with a convincing 29-13 over Bishop Guertin.

The Cardinals started the season with two wins and were undefeated headed into the game, but the LHS squad was able to hand them their first defeat of the season.

The Lancers blitzed the Cards early and often keeping their opponents out of the end zone until the final minutes of the game.

Londonderry scored in each of the four quarters with points tallied from three different sources.

After the LHS defense forced a three-and-out

on the Cards to start the first quarter, the home crew marched down the field for their first points of the game with a 17-yard run by Andrew Kullman to the left side of the line. Lancer kicker Dylan Wrisley tacked on the extra point for a 7-0 lead at 5:43.

By the second quarter, BG used up all their time-outs in the half at nine minutes, and was unable to convert a fourth down from the Lancer 26-yard line.

The Lancers took control of the ball to end the second quarter with a drive that ended with Aidan Washington passing complete to Jake Schena for a 37-yard touchdown with 30-seconds left in the half. A two-point conversion pass by Washington to Colby Ramshaw ended the period 15-0.

In that drive, the Cards made it to the LHS

22, where they attempted an unsuccessful fourth down with six yards to go.

After the Lancer took over on downs, they marched to their own 42, where Jake Schena ran up the middle for a 58-yard touchdown with four seconds left in the third quarter. Wrisley's point after kick was good for the 22-0 Lancer lead.

Bishop Guertin was finally able to put some much-needed points on the board nine minutes into the fourth quarter, making the score 22-6.

Lancer QB Washington answered with a five-yard run for six points of his own, five minutes later, for the final points of the game for Londonderry making it 29-6.

The Cardinals were able to add a kick-off return for a touchdown

at the four-minute mark and with an extra-point the game ended at 29-13.

Londonderry managed 315 offensive yards in the game and BG was half of that at 150.

Washington was the top rusher with 113-yards and Schena wound up with 64.

Schena also had 37 receiving yards with Trevor Weinmann getting 22 to lead the LHS squad.

The third straight victory put Londonderry at 3-0 headed into their biggest contest of the season. Next week the lancers will play in the annual Mack Plaque game in Derry against Pinkerton Academy who is also boasting an undefeated season so far.

Last year, LHS beat PA 23-14 just before Pinkerton ended their season due to COVID-19.


