123rd Old Home Day Festivities Begin on Wednesday, Aug. 17

The celebration of Londonderry's 123rd Old Home Day will begin on Wednesday afternoon, Aug. 17, with the annual senior BBQ and Bingo at the Lions Hall Pavillion,

as well as a free concert on the Town Common.

Bingo will start at 4 p.m. and the BBQ will be served at 5 p.m. The concert, featuring Beatles music from the '60s, will start at 7 p.m.

On Thursday night, Aug. 18, the Old Home

Day "Battle of the Bands" will take the stage on the Town Common starting at 5 p.m.

On Friday night, beginning at 5 p.m., Police and Fire personnel from Derry and Londonderry will square off in the annual

Budget Committee Discusses Future Spending for Schools

The Londonderry Budget Committee met last week and prioritized the issue of where to prioritize school spending following the release of the Capital Improvement Program.

The issue of school debt was related to its expiration over the next few years. School District CFO, Peter Curro, stated expiring debt was not necessarily a good thing. Expired debt represents bond money not

being spent on the schools. While this removes costs from the town budget, it also raises questions regarding how money is being spent, especially with the recently proposed Capital Improvement Program.

"Good news is you don't have any debt to put in the budget" Curro said. "But you've also got the other set of the coin, which is the district managing, its facilities, and infrastructure so that it's periodically updating its needs to

meet enrollment and changes in technology."

He also noted that approving a bond is not equivalent to spending that bond money. Local taxpayers only feel an impact once the money has been used by the school or any public agency. Committee members expressed concern over whether school money is being spent in the right place, especially at Moose Hill School, where Curro identified one of the larger spending issues in the

Role and Pay of Retired School CFO Questioned

The role and the payment for services for retire School District Chief Financial Officer (CFO), Peter Curro, was questioned during the Public Comment section of the Tuesday, Aug. 2, School Board meeting.

Resident, Glenn Douglas, questioned the School Board on what the district will be paying Curro after learning during a recent Budget Committee meeting that he will be "staying on as a consultant."

Curro retired from the district in the beginning of July, after working for several decades in Londonderry.

Douglas said he had sent an email to the school board asking about how much the district is paying Curro and who approved of the decision, but never received a response to his questions.

School Board Chair, Amy Finamore, responded by saying there are certainly sensitivities around discussing personnel issues, but added that Curro does not have a contract with the district and is not receiving any pay.

Douglas was a bit perplexed by the statement, "So when the CFO said he's staying on, he just made that up? Or is he staying on for free? He's not getting paid?"

Douglas also questioned why Curro was presenting the 10-year plan proposal on behalf of the school district at last week's Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) meeting.

"I'm assuming a consultant gets paid. He's not just doing it for free, or does no one here actually know that?"

School Board member, Bob Slater, interject-

future 2024 budget.

“Moose Hill has a real problem; it needs four regular education classrooms and money spent for leaking programs” according to Curro, who believed that such a problem needs to be

fixed within the next year, followed by the anticipated reconstruction of the High School.

Committee Chair, Steve Breault, briefly overviewed decisions recently made by the Capital Improvement Program Committee. The Program highlights essential investments

needed for Londonderry schools over the next 20 years as some improvements will receive present above others in the town budget.

He explained immediate student safety issues have the highest priority in the Capital Improvement Plan. Proposed designs already

have that safety in mind. “If we redesign these schools, it’s going to be a safer design,” Breault said. However, the Committee hopes to prioritize spending according to the value a school project has in budgetary terms. “What it comes down to is the question of cost-savings. If there’s a cost-savings here, this is a higher priority.” This means a desire to push back several urgent issues unrelated to safety in the Capital Improvement Plan.

Finally, Breault expressed his desire to give the Planning Board, along with the School Board, an opportunity to review spending priorities for the Capital Improvement Program.

The 2022-2023 Londonderry budget expects to take in more money than it spends. The current school

spending plan is available online for public review and is still subject to further modification before final approval. Extensive spending in the proposed plan will not be included in the

budget until 2024.

The Londonderry Budget Committee has a two-day meeting scheduled for Aug. 24 and 25. The discussion for each day will begin at 6 p.m., each day.

The \$286M Proposed School CIP Projects should have begun with "Dear Santa Claus"

Regarding last week's front-page article in the Londonderry Times about the School District's proposed projects, I observe the following:

The School District and their architect have devised a plan which purportedly covers the next 20 years, yet many of the improvements are set at "Priority Two", meaning they are necessary within three years. Still, some of the improvements have been deemed "Priority Four", meaning they can be held off for six years. The new SAU building is in that Priority Four category and I agree that this should happen. To continue to pay rent while a viable, permanent solution is apparent just makes sense. But it is when I read that an auditorium (and other things) at Londonderry High School is needed, that is when I apply the brakes.

ed, "I think he was there because he submitted the paper work back in June, before his retirement started. I think he was there as a courtesy, because he was the one that filled those documents out."

Douglas still ques-

tioned whether the board understood what was happening in regard to Curro "staying on." Adding that at the Budget Committee meeting Curro stated he would be covering a number of vacant positions this spring.

Douglas also questioned why the School Board had not given an

opinion on the nearly \$300 million 10-year Plan proposal deliver to the CIP Committee.

Douglas said, "The plan is being proposed by a company that builds schools." He added, "If you got a hammer, everything looks like a nail. In my opinion, it's the residents that are getting hammered right now with no opinion from the school board."

To those comments Slater responded, the

district hired the architectural company for \$150,000 and they did an assessment of the overall conditions of schools in town. Saying that nothing is set yet to move forward and when they are ready to move forward, the school board will give their opinion and there will also be plenty of opportunity for public comment.

He added that the district will need com-

munity support to get these projects done, so we want all the questions answered to do it.

Resident, Laura El-Azem, also addressed the district's future plans saying that she would like to see plans be put off a few years, at least until the economy

recovers. She cited the tax increases residents recently received after the latest assessment increase saying, "These tax increases are unsustainable."

The board did not respond to El-Azem's statement.

School Board Offers \$500 Bonus Amidst Support Staff Shortages

The Londonderry School Board debated a chronic shortage of support staff in a number of areas throughout the school district during its Tuesday evening, Aug. 2 meeting.

A recent survey, cited by the district, found that fewer special education aids, custodians, and dining employees are available, despite job openings. The consensus is that a flat salary during inflation has made it harder for support staff to meet their day-to-day expenses on current salaries, leading to problems related to employee retention.

"One specific piece of feedback that was

served to us was a struggle to be fully staffed" according to board chair, Amy Finamore. Adding that support staff shortages "caused difficulty in daily operation throughout the district and for the past few months we have been having open dialogues in meetings to determine how to address it."

In response, the School Board proposed a one-time, \$500 retention payment to members of the support staff willing to commit to work through at least the 2022-2023 school year. The bonus draws funding from unassigned money in the annual budget. Members emphasized that the retention payment is a stop gap measure intended as a temporary

solution. The Board will continue to look for a long-term solution. All support staff will be eligible, including non-unionized cafeteria employees.

Several members of the public noted that while the bonus proposal is welcome, it was not nearly enough to meet expenses. Speakers expressed frustration at budget cuts during the pandemic combined with flat pay since the union signed the last labor contract over two years ago. Some support employees currently make less than \$15 per hour, despite the rising cost of food, rent, and gas.

"How did it happen that these people are being paid so little?" asked Londonderry resi-

dent, Christine Perez. "I can go to Walmart and make more money, and I'm not responsible for the education and safety and growth of children," Perez questioned why union representatives and Board members have taken so long to agree to a pay increase.

"We're going into negotiations entering our third year, with the support staff on a three-year contract that was agreed upon with the union and the support

staff, we have a lot of wheels in motion" stated board member, Bob Slater. "We'd like to get some input from the committee of support staff, and our committee to start working towards a solution." He also warned that the Board was limited in what it could do in the short-term, hoping to get more feedback directly from the support staff over the next few weeks, acknowledging "the pay scale has changed dra-

matically over the past two years."

Any extensive change to the school budget beyond the unassigned education fund will require additional discussion and public approval. As such, no action was taken beyond approving the \$500 retention bonus.

The Londonderry School Board will hold its next regular meeting at 7 pm on August 18 at the Londonderry High School café.

About the CIP

To the editor,

From the School Board, we want to share infor-

mation about the Capital Improvement Plan and Facilities Master Plan with the community. Many of you have likely seen the total price tag and rightly, feel anxious or concerned.

We know that we have a tremendous amount of square footage across our six schools, and that most of our schools are on the older side- with parts Matthew Thornton being 70-years old. As a first step in understanding where we stood, in November 2019, the school board hired a firm to go through our schools and assess where we are today and identify our most pressing areas of need and recommend priorities.

We learned that while many of our mechanical and electrical systems are near end of life, they would have reached their end-of-life years ago if it weren't for the amazing work of our facilities and custodial teams across the district. We also learned that while grandfathered, parts of our buildings no longer meet current building code, impacting our ability to do certain renovations. Additionally, our buildings are less conducive to the way today's teach-

ing and learning happens- such as insufficient lab, art and library spaces as well as interior classrooms that lack access to natural light.

We also want to share what this plan is and is not- this plan is not a work order and it is not a project plan. Any large scale planned improvement goes to voters for their approval or denial and this is no different. While a CIP plan covers municipal buildings, in many ways it is similar to how any of us might look at our homes and think we want to add a garage one day but we need to prioritize replacing old windows instead- this plan identifies wants and needs, and is the first step in providing the entire community the information we need to have informed conversations and make informed decisions.


Police Chief Officially Retires with Ceremony at LPD




